*The Hasheesh Eater* Fitz Hugh Ludlow 2006-07-06 Fitz-Hugh Ludlow was a recent graduate of Union College in Schenectady, New York, when he vividly recorded his hasheesh-induced visions, experiences, adventures, and insights.
