Webpulmonary, cardiovascular [except isolated hypertension], renal, hepatic, neurologic, hematologic, or metabolic disorders (includ-ing diabetes mellitus) • Moderate or severe acute illness with or without fever Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) • Severe allergic reaction (e.g., anaphylaxis) after a previous dose or to a vaccine component

Chronic Kidney Management of Chronic Kidney Disease

Web• Blood pressure control reduces renal disease progression and cardiovascular morbidity/ mortality. - Target BP <130/80 mm Hg if without hypotension risk (eg, without: orthostatic hypotension, heart ... Family history of kidney disease . Obesity or metabolic syndrome . Volume depletion . Acute urinary obstruction : Use of diuretics, ACE or ARB .
