**The Philosophy of Causality in Economics** Mariusz Maziarz 2020-05-13 Approximately one in six top economic research papers draws an explicitly causal conclusion. But what do economists mean when they conclude that A 'causes' B? Does 'cause' say that we can influence B by intervening on A, or is it only a label for the correlation of variables? Do quantitative analyses of observational data followed by such causal inferences constitute sufficient grounds for guiding economic policymaking? *The Philosophy of Causality in Economics* addresses these questions by analyzing the meaning of causal claims made by economists and the philosophical presuppositions underlying the research methods used.
